^{*}Bethany Deacons previously maintained a savings account at Wells Fargo to transfer funds in/out to forego bank fees. Wells Fargo instituted a monthly fee on accounts not maintaining a \$500.00 minimum daily balance. We requested and received \$500.00 from the Bethany general account in January 2022 that will sit untouched in the Deacon checking account to avoid future service charges. This is to explain the difference in our usable funds/checkbook balance of \$608.14 versus the Wells Fargo balance of \$1108.04 at year-end 2022.

Buildings and Grounds Committee

Because of COVID, activity for the year was largely curtailed in terms of any gathering to perform work but as things are opening up we will resume regular meeting/workdays. We are presently meeting through email. With regards to church-wide-semi-annual Work Days (described below) as the Pandemic is winding down we will resume having those this Spring and Fall.

The Committee manages our janitorial service, Centurion Services. To save money, we purchase janitorial supplies for the church rather than paying them a premium to do so; Dave handles supply coordination with the Centurion office.

Twice a year we ordinarily organize church-wide Work Days to spruce up the campus for Easter and Christmas. This is when many regular church members lend a hand in cleaning and maintaining the church. The Spring Work Day was canceled, and we resumed by having one last November 26.

Please be aware that there are tasks for every skill level during our Work Days (indoors and out) and everyone is encouraged to participate!

Here are the activities the Committee is responsible for, or performed, in 2022 to maintain the church building and grounds.

- General maintenance of grounds Weeding, lawn mowing, hedge trimming, brush control, clearing debris (mostly pine needles and litter) from the parking lot, tree trimming, roof gutters cleared of debris, on both the church-wide Work Days and monthly B&G work days/meetings (we will, again, incorporate our monthly meetings into the Committee's scheduled work day for that particular month).
- Roll out the garbage, recycling, and green cans every Tuesday evening.
 Many thanks to *George Lynch* and *Tamra Hollenbeck* for helping out with this when *Dave* is away.
- Organize and coordinate semi-annual church-wide Work Days. These will resume for 2023. Activities include: Window washing, dusting, spider web clearing, light bulb changing, cleaning the valley gutter between the upper and lower parking lots, wiping down woodwork and handrails, rain gutters cleaned, vacuuming of Sanctuary chairs, etc.
- * Janitorial supplies purchased for janitorial service (as mentioned above).
- Programming of the two timers in downstairs Boiler Room that automate heating of the upstairs and the downstairs.
- Large pothole in the upper parking lot that was starting to become problematic was repaired in early spring.
- One of the two kitchen sinks had been out of commission due to the garbage disposal somehow becoming punctured. New garbage disposal installed in June remedied the problem.

- We started to notice, earlier in the year, that our water bill was starting to get bigger and bigger. After checking with the Sikh Gurdwara we determined it most likely was a leak somewhere in the building. *Ken Henry, Fred Matthews* and *Dave Wales* did a thorough inspection of Bethany's plumbing system, and finally isolated the leak to our now unused irrigation system, where it intersected the interior plumbing at the southwest corner of the building. We dug up the area and brought in a plumber to cap it off problem solved. I also understand that we were able to partially offset our loss by contacting the San Bruno Utility Dept. and providing proof of our work.
- During May and June, *Ken Henry* and *Fred Matthews* repaired the outside steps to the lower level. Several steps had started to rot now the stairs are in good shape.
- A decorative trash receptacle (plastic resin) was obtained in September and placed next to the entrance at the southwest corner of the church to help address the accumulation of litter.
- The downspout at the southwest corner of the church rusted through at the elbow. The existing downspout was repaired and reinstalled in December.
- Dead Tree Removal: In early July we obtained an estimate from our arborist, the Tree Guys, for the removal of 10 dead trees (on our property not including the green belt surrounding our church) which amounted to approximately \$10,000.00, or \$1,000.00 a tree. Shortly thereafter we were notified by PG&E that they were going to be doing some tree maintenance on our hillside for fire safety, and were provided the name of a contact person with the subcontractor PG&E had arranged. So, we placed a hold on the pending estimate with the Tree Guys and waited to see how much of the work we sought to have done would be done. Turns out all of it and then some. PG&E's subcontractor has finally dealt with all the dead trees which could have posed fire safety concerns.

The care of Bethany's building and grounds is a huge task, and thanks to the many hands of the members of this Committee and congregation for pitching in, the big task is manageable. **Many hands make light work!** AND we are always looking for

new members so if you are interested in exercising your unique landscaping, carpentry, or just happy disposition skill-set to the greater glory of the Lord and Bethany please ask a Committee member about joining us!

Community Action/Life Committee

Bethany Presbyterian's Community Action/Life Committee works to help others through our actions and initiate fellowship through ongoing activities. As we came out of the pandemic era in September 2022, we were able to spend the last quarter of the year fulfilling our mission.

The Presbytery of San Francisco's "Fund Your Vision" \$50,000.00 grant, written in 2020, was a great help to the *Catholic Worker Hospitality House* (CWHH) in San Bruno. After providing \$25,000 to CWHH in 2021 (five payments of \$5,000.00), we then provided the balance of the funds to CWHH in 2022, which enabled CWHH, led by *Peter Stiehler*, to provide food and other supplies to those in need in the tricity area of San Bruno, Millbrae, and South San Francisco. Some of the grant funds were even used to build an ADU (Auxiliary Dwelling Unit) which is a long-term goal for CWHH. Community Action continues to look for and complete grant applications which will allow us to provide even more funds to those in need.

Our assistance to *Iglesias Brasiliana*, a congregation worshiping at First Presbyterian in San Mateo, continued until April 2022, with deliveries approximately every month until *Pastor George Abdala* indicated we should stop our ongoing collections and he would advise if further assistance was needed. Deliveries included groceries, diapers, toiletries, baby clothes, blankets, and other household goods. As our partner, *Iglesias Brasiliana* knows they can always count on Bethany as we are just a phone call away. Seeing the smiling faces of the people waiting to help unload the deliveries was heartwarming, and the volunteers at *Iglesias Brasiliana* were always happy to see us and grateful for everything.

Financial Trustees

The Bethany Presbyterian Church congregation fully supported the church's vision throughout 2022 allowing the Trustees to successfully complete the year by receiving contributions more than our original budget. The congregation faithfully fulfilled their generous giving which enabled the Trustees to continue operations in San Bruno. Our continued appreciation to everyone as we collectively enabled Bethany Church to continue our work in the community and the world.

The Trustees spent time in 2022 making sure our finances were in order, working with Session and Personnel to ensure our staff members were onboard and working to the best of their ability, which included a Christmas bonus and modest salary adjustments for 2023. We also continued to with our tenant, who occupies

the downstairs of our building, as well as deciding how to proceed with many situations presented to us during the year.

Pledges, tenant income, one-time gifts, and increased general giving make up the income received at Bethany Church.

The Financial Trustees work to thoughtfully manage our resources to make sure we support the overall vision of the church. Our finances are healthy, and in spite of fewer pledging units, we maintained our ability to function throughout the year due to the generosity of our congregation. We also have the pleasure of working alongside our tenant which adds to our income. The church continued to provide Presbytery USA support for mission giving in the amount of \$7,200.00, which is the same rate as in 2021.

In addition, the church continues our giving spirit to show visible compassion to others in need by contributing cash or other items outside of our General Fund income to the following additional mission projects:

Partnership with *Iglesias Brasiliana*, San Mateo (through April 2022 only): \$0.00 (household goods, food, diapers, blankets, toiletries, and other supplies but no cash gifts from Bethany's budget)

Catholic Workers Hospital House (San Bruno Shelter): \$0.00 (Food/supply offerings through the year but no cash gifts from Bethany's budget)

Peacemaking Offering: \$885.00

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering (sent to PC USA): \$961.25

Total cash \$1,846.25

In December 2022, Bethany Church also completed payments from the grant received from Presbytery of San Francisco in the amount of \$50,000.00 payable to the Catholic Workers Hospital House in quarterly increments of \$5,000.00. It was a joy to hear what was accomplished by CWHH from the funds provided by the grant over the last two years.

Worship Committee
