Happy August Bethany! IT'S HAPPENING!

On August 10th of 2019, George sent me an email about picking me up at San Bruno BART the next day so that I could be your guest preacher on August 11th. When George made that first cold call to invite me, I said no because I didn't have a ready way to do pulpit supply outside of San Francisco, but if he couldn't find anyone, he should call me back. He did call back, and in what I have come to know as true Bethany fashion, he made it work.

After a joyful ride with George and Ollie, and after a beautiful, gentle, friendly and helpful welcome by Bonnie, the liturgist for the day, I met many of you. Bonnie showed me the grounds, and explained about the mural. At that point in my life, I had been regular pulpit supply at many different churches, one at a time, and was not looking for a permanent pastor position. I just didn't think there was a church out there that I would want to be committed to. But when I left Bethany after my first time

here, I was a little dismayed to discover that I felt so attached. "Too bad I'm not looking for a pastor job, because I think that's a church I could enjoy." I loved especially the powerful witness of a group of people who turned to art in the most grievous time of pain. I was a little mad about these strong feelings I had, because I couldn't *not* pay attention. I didn't share my feelings with anyone – no need to get anyone else involved, who might then encourage me, and then, well, who knows what might happen!

George called after my second pulpit supply opportunity with you, and asked if I would apply for the transitional pastor position you were offering. I said, "Well, funny you should ask. Let me tell you about my first impression of Bethany that day." Later he asked if I could put together a resume by the next day because a few people wanted to meet me. I asked if this was a job interview or a chat and he said, oh, no big deal, a few people want to meet you. The next day, 11 people and I met for a 2-hour "non-interview."

Here we are three-plus years and a global pandemic later and you are about to install your next permanent pastor! This may be a big day for me, but it's a *huge* day for you, the people of Bethany now, as well as your ancestors who have nurtured Bethany from the beginning. Congratulations to all of you for all of the love and work that sustains not only calling a pastor, but maintaining the community.

For me, being "installed" sounds like I am a refrigerator, or dish washer, or that pesky new plumbing fixture. Thus the construction graphic above. For a time, using the word "installation" was in question, so we tried to come up with names like "The Non-Installation of our New Pastor." Thus the crossed out word "installation." Being playful and purple, well that's just me...with help from Cathleen!

Volunteers are needed at Belle Air Elementary School in San Bruno (SBPSD) the 4th Wednesday of each month from 2:00 – 4:00 pm for a Food Bank Grocery Distribution which typically services approx. 270 families. There are also opportunities to help with food distributions at Skyline College. Check out <u>https://ww.shfb.org</u> for more information on how to volunteer or to read what is being done about food insecurity in San Mateo County.
- Community Action and the Deacons are going to work together to provide 25-30 toiletry bags to the Catholic Worker Hospitality House in San Bruno in August 2023. We will pack these bags after a church service near the end of August. If you have/would like to donate any of the following items, please bring to the church or call Lyn Hughes to pick them up: Toothbrushes, small toothpaste tubes, bars of soap, washcloths, Kleenex packets, combs, shampoo, conditioner, band aids, and nail files or emery boards.
- Additionally, Community Action and the Deacons are going to collect school supplies, and provide 25 backpacks for Allen School in San Bruno. We are thinking "kindergarten" aged supplies. Please plan to have any school supplies or backpack donations to Bethany by **AUGUST 25.** Supply List: pencils, colored pencils, 16-24 box crayons, small Elmer's glue bottles, erasers, rulers, small safety scissors, etc.
- Continued communication with Peter Stiehler at Catholic Worker Hospitality House for needs they may have at their facilities. Current needs include: Oatmeal, paper napkins, toilet tissue, canned soup, canned fruit, milk, butter or margarine, sliced bread, soup spoons, new or unused shampoo, new unopened disposable razors, socks, and new or clean, used bath towels.

Financial Trustees

Financial Items:

- **Continued contact with our tenant, the Sikh Association.** Plans for an outside cooking structure were received which do not require a permit. Work on the structure has begun but is in the early stages. Monthly calendars from the Sikhs are now being received.
- **Grounds Clean-Up and Other Building Issues** The cleanup effort began on June 27 and is nearly complete with a few items that still need attention. There are some broken tree branches which will be removed. Additional trimming work on the west hill will be done as a Phase 2 project. We have asked for a final bill once the tree trimming has occurred. We have also asked for a proposal for ongoing grounds maintenance so we can keep the grounds in good condition ongoing. An other possible project is transition to solar energy.
 - Work in progress: In an effort to have a secure parking lot, the **Session will implement safety measures which included cameras, chains across the entrance and exit** when the building is not being used by Bethany or the Sikh Association, and additional signs regarding access to the property.
 - In progress: **Room 9 clean-up and removal of various large items** in anticipation of this room's being used for evening meetings; also discussion about new window treatments in this room.
 - Discussion regarding possible kitchen updates: possible new or refaced cabinets, and an island replacement or update. A Kitchen Update Committee was formed (Lyn Hughes, Tamra Hollenbeck, Roxane Wales, and Chris Angeles). More information will be forthcoming once we review what needs to be done and create a proposal for the updates.
- Update to Pastor Deb McGuire's contract: Deb's contract is being updated since Deb will become our Pastor rather than our Transitional Pastor. This effort will also result in a change to her current contract as a Medical Reimbursement will be added to her regular paycheck each month, and this will also become a 2024 budget addition.
- **Sound system and electronics updates:** a proposal was received from George Lynch regarding replacements, updates, and some possible repairs to maintain our sound and electronic equipment. The Session voted to go ahead and further information will be provided once the project begins. Pricing and procurement is now underway.
- **Organ repair** due to an unexpected event, some issues occurred to the organ, and we are contacting someone to perform the needed repairs which after further review, look to be minor but need attention. There were no issues found with the grand piano.
- We are also reviewing some credit card opportunities for the church.
- **Patio repair** on hold until mid-summer; a suggestion was made to include a labyrinth in the new patio.
- Roof/siding repair it was brought to the Session's attention by Craig Bray and Fred Matthews that repairs are needed on a certain section of the roof edging, and the repair was originally estimated at about \$1,000. However, due to the fact that scaffolding will be needed to make the repairs, the estimate has increased to \$2,500 \$3,000. Session approved the expense and the repairs are now underway.
- **On-line giving opportunities** calls will be made to find out how to offer this service including to Congregational Church in San Mateo (CCSM) who implemented this service in the past year.
