Dear friends,

Hope, Peace, Joy, Love. Or is it Hope, Peace, Love, Joy? Or is it Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace? Do we light the Christ candle on Christmas Eve, or Christmas Day? Is it the candle of Light? Or the Christ candle? Blue or purple candles? Pink for just one candle?

Yes!

However our particular tradition marks the season of Advent, we all are using this particular season for the same reason. We are marking the time before we celebrate the first coming of God as a human, the birth of Jesus. We are also using this time to consider the time in the future when Christ will come again. The early church used the time before Easter to prepare new converts for their baptism which would occur on Easter Sunday. During that time the color purple was used to mark suffering, prayer and repentance to represent the ultimate gift Christ gave to us. Once the birth of Christ was assigned to the day in December, a similar amount of time before Christmas was also given to prepare new converts for their baptism on Christmas Day. In the same way we use purple, and use the time to remind us of the gifts that Christ brought to us, like light, hope, peace, joy, love, and faith. All of the symbols we use are human made symbols to represent this ancient story that we are all a part of in real time.

What other words might we use if we could each choose our own four words to celebrate this time of readiness, preparedness, and waiting? What about candle colors? In some traditions there are 24 red candles. Or one red candle with 24 marks and the candle is lit every day for 24 days, and allowed to melt down to the next mark each day.

No matter the outward symbols and colors, all who have ever marked this season of Advent have one thing in common. Advent is always celebrated in community.

I hope you join in partaking in any of our Advent community events this year. We will decorate the sanctuary on December 3rd during our Harvest Festival. We will celebrate communion on Sunday, December 4th. We will have an adult education opportunity weekly. And of course we will have our Christmas Eve service, as well as a short worship service on Sunday, December 25th. Mark your calendars for these experiences of joy together!

Advent Education – Make Peace

Our first study was Tuesday, November 29. We are using the PC(USA) Follow Me curriculum studying their series called Make Peace. *Make Peace* focuses on Jesus' words in the Beatitudes, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9), which have been the centerpiece of Christian social ethics for centuries. People,

throughout history and still today, have chosen different paths to peace, but certain skills of peacemaking have emerged from their journeys: cultivating inner peace, seeking to understand where others are coming from, and having the courage to overcome fear. By practicing these skills, peacemakers work to embody Jesus' teachings in the midst of conflict. Explore God's vision for peace, true shalom, in this unit from *Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living*. Our next meetings via Zoom are at **7pm Tuesdays**, **December 6 and December 13. The final meeting is on a Monday, December 19.**

Updates on the following issues:

1. Renewal of Pastor Deb McGuire's 2023 Annual Contract/Mission Study:

Our Mission Study information sent to the Presbytery of San Francisco was approved. We are now awaiting next steps on completing the Pastor Information Form/Church Information Form in order to finalize our Called Pastor requirements. We plan to have all information requested from PofSF ready by their December 2022 meeting.

2. Renewal of the Sikh Association Multi-Year Lease (2023 – 2027):

Michael Glass, legal counsel for the Presbytery of San Francisco, is still working on the updates to our lease with the Sikh Association. Mr. Glass plans to have a draft ready for review the week of November 28. We will still need to review the lease as will the Sikh Association. Once we have both agreed to the updated terms and conditions, both parties will sign the lease.

3. Cleanup of the Bethany Church Grounds:

The Trustees brought a recommendation to Session on 10/18/22 for a one-time cleanup of the entire Bethany grounds. This was approved. The Trustees will start requesting bids from for this project in January 2023 from appropriate landscape renewal contractors.

4. Bids Received:

Replacement or Repair of the Patio Outside the Church Building:

This project is currently on hold until January 2023. Bids will be reviewed and/or updated.

Replacement of Kitchen Stove/Removal of Non-working Stoves:

A stove was selected for our kitchen. The stove has now been purchased from TriMark/R.W. Smith Company and a check sent to the vendor. The stove will soon be delivered and installed. The two older stoves will be removed from our kitchen. Many thanks to Jorie Abbott for her assistance in locating and purchasing our new stove.

5. Annual Stewardship Campaign for 2023:

Our 2023 Stewardship Campaign has begun and Stewardship letters, including pledge cards, have been mailed. We ask that you prayerfully consider your commitment to Bethany for 2023. **Please plan to return your pledge card by December 18**. A dedication will occur that same day. Note that Bethany is now able to accept stock to fulfill donation commitments. For more information, please contact Lyn Hughes at 650-867-0667.

6. Annual Church Budget preparation for 2023:

A preliminary budget is now in place after a review at the October 18 Session meeting and updates presented at the November Session meeting. A modest Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) is planned for our staff.

The budget will be completed once the Annual Stewardship Campaign is finalized, which is planned for December 18. Session approval is anticipated at their December meting.

7. Church Secretary Position: Our Church Secretary position has been posted with the Presbytery of San Francisco as well as other employment sites. For questions, please contact Pastor Deb McGuire.

November 15, 2022 Session Meeting at Bethany 7:00-8:15pm

Pastor Deb opened the meeting in prayer followed by a group sing of Amazing Grace.

- The October 18th meeting minutes were approved by consensus.
- Roxane reported an update from the Nominating Committee:
 - --Kathryn Quickert will be going off of Session at the end of December 2022 (Thank you KQ), George Lynch and Lyn Hughes have begun serving on Session beginning October 2022. Lyn is leading the Financial Trustees and Chair of Community Action/Life Committee. George is the Chair of Personnel.
 - --Bonnie Morgan will be leaving the Board of Deacons at the end of December 2022. (Thank you Bonnie!) Kathy Fogle, Tamra Hollenbeck and Roxane Wales will continue serving as Deacons. They will reach out for assistance when needed. (If you are interested in giving the Deacons a hand please contact Kathy F., Tamra or Roxane.)
- Pastor Deb reported on Pastoral Care and upcoming Advent Adult Study.
- Pastor Deb will be away 12/26/22-01/2/23. Jessica will be away 12/25/22 with fill-in TBD.
- A Narrative Mission Study is in the works! The initial questions/answers have been approved by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. The next set of questions have been answered and will be addressed by COM at the December meeting. Thank you to Tamra, Pam & Lyn.
- <u>Financial Trustees</u> Lyn reported that the 2023 Stewardship Campaign has been prepared and will be sent shortly.
- <u>Building and Grounds</u> Dave reported that the parking lot metal storage shed will be disassembled and sent to the dump.
 - --B&G is working on clearing BPC defensible space for fire safety. PG&E has been taking down dead trees in the easement east of our building.
 - -- Dave will call for annual furnace maintenance.
 - --After a discussion about using BPC as an election center, it was agreed that it worked well and we will consider doing it again if asked.
- <u>Personnel</u> The BPC secretary position has been posted on the Presbytery website, Kathy Q. will post it on the BPC website and is approved to be added to Next Door and Craig's List.
