Dear friends,

Our liturgical calendar tells us that we remain in the season of Epiphany for three of the four weeks in February. The term epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" or even "to reveal."

We have been asking the question each week, "What does the revelation of Christ's full divinity "show" to you in this particular season of Epiphany? In this way, we hope to discover the deeper meaning of not just Christmas, but the deeper meaning of the whole of the Christian story, through each season of the liturgical year.

The secular calendar helps bring parts of our cultural life to mind in different ways. Did you know that February is a month full of a national holiday or two every single day? Some of them are funny (International Dog Biscuit Appreciation Day, Canned Food Month, National Get Up Day, National Tater Tot Day, Elmo's Birthday), some of them are from other cultures (Lunar New Year, Kashmir Solidarity Day, Waitangi Day), some are from Hallmark or popular culture (Valentine's Day, Groundhog Day), and some are special reminders of events we like to remember in order to honor or celebrate or reflect upon. One of those is Black History Month.

The story of Black History Month goes back to 1915 when a prominent historian and a minister founded Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. In 1926 the association sponsored Negro History Week in February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. Since 1976 every American President has designated February as Black History Month and endorsed a specific theme.

Whatever February means to you culturally – Valentine's Day, Groundhog Day, Elmo's birthday, or Lunar New Year or Black History Month – may this month be one in which the Christian message of the glory of Christ is the ultimate meaning.

Session Meeting Highlights Tuesday, January 18, 2022

- 1. The Congregational Meeting to present the 2022 Budget and 2021 Annual report will be held on Sunday, February 13, to start ten minutes after worship. It was decided that a hybrid meeting would be best with some people in person and others on zoom to meet comfort levels.
- 2. Annual reports from committee chairs and other groups are due to Roberta Henry by January 30. She will make them available to the congregation the following week in order to give people time to look over the reports and the budget.
- 3. Lyn Hughes is going off Session as of 2022. There will be four elders serving the church in 2022 Ken Henry, Pam Matthews, Kathryn Quickert, and Dave Wales.
- 4. Financial Trustees: General giving and pledges for 2021 were above budget. We are entering the new year financially strong with some surplus funds.
- 5. Buildings and Grounds: Dave will send out an email requesting assistance to fix the right kitchen sink. Dave will also place an article in the monthly newsletter with possible projects that need to be done at the church.
- 6. Worship: Choir and Prayz are taking a hiatus through January because of concerns of the corona virus. The committee is seeking to draw attention to specific worship themes: i.e. Black History, Earth Day/environmental issues, Pride awareness, etc. The idea is to plan in advance for these themes so they can be planned accordingly.
- 7. Pastor: Inho Kim and Committee on Ministry representative Jenny will meet with Session on Tuesday, February 1 to begin discussion regarding Bethany's journey towards creating a mission study and Pastor Nominating Committee.


COMMUNITY ACTION/LIFECOMMITTEE

News about our Partnership with Iglesias Brasiliana – San Mateo: At this time, we are taking a break from collecting **food items** for Iglesias Brasiliana.

However, Pastor Jorge Abdala has asked us to consider collecting our "change" (pennies, nickels, dimes, or quarters) to their congregation's program "Multiplying Talents." This fund helps those in the IPB congregation in need. No matter the number of coins, no matter the amount, please bring your donation to the church and place in the glass jar labeled "Coins for Iglesias Brasiliana" which is on the small table where you pick up your Sunday bulletin. We have already collected approximately \$250.00 which has been delivered to Pastor Jorge and we know we can do more. Look in your purse, desk, drawers, etc. and find those unwanted or unused coins and bring them to church. Your continued prayers for the IPB congregation are very much appreciated.

Ongoing we will be providing funds from our Fund-a-Vision grant to the Catholic Worker Hospitality House (the San Bruno Shelter) for various needs. In 2021, we paid out \$25,000 of the original \$50,000 grant. We expect to make our next payment by approximately March 1.
