Do you know?

We all are thankful for Goodwill and the various recipients of our discarded clothing. It does more than just help folks, since the last thing we want to do is throw our clothes in the garbage (landfill). According to one source, clothing in landfills are responsible for 10% of all carbon emissions on the planet. Did you know that 95% of used textiles of all sorts can be recycled or repurposed? Even fabric scraps can be donated to Goodwill (but call first to make sure the individual site will take them). Another thing to consider is the actual production cost for new clothes, since it takes so many resources to produce, demanding human labor (watch *The True Cost*, a documentary available on You Tube for a sobering look at fashion industry and the implications of our love for cheap new clothes), and huge amounts of water and energy. Let's join the movement toward a different relationship to clothing, buying less, choosing more sustainable sources, using thrift stores more and getting creative with reuse! (Check out Upworthy.com for a good article on this subject!)

1. Next meeting: July 20, 2021

COMMUNITY ACTION/LIFE COMMITTEE

- 1. News about Our Partnership with Iglesias Brasiliana San Mateo: We continue to collect items for Iglesias Brasiliana, our partner in San Mateo. "Needs" include non-perishable food items, especially rice and pinto beans. Cans of soup, chili, or canned vegetables or fruit are also needed. Other useful items are toiletries, blankets, and paper products.
 - Our next collection items will be for school supplies for the children: Notebook paper, pencils, 16 or 24 packs of crayons, 12" rulers, small scissors (child size), and colored pencils. Please bring any supplies to the church and place in the Narthex under the coat rack. Donations are also welcome to help purchase these supplies. Please continue to prayer for this congregation and consider how you might be able to help. We continue with discussions about how we might help through the end of this year.
- 2. Ongoing we will be providing funds from our Fund-a-Vision grant to the Catholic Worker Hospitality House (the San Bruno Shelter) for various needs. During July, we will make our third \$5,000 donation from the grant. At this time, the greatest physical needs are for food, toiletries, and blankets. We also plan to put together 25 50 additional toiletry bags for CWHH by the end of August. Items needed are bars of soap, washcloths, disposable razors, small deodorants, small bottles of shampoo, combs, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and socks. Items can be brought to the church and put in the Narthex. Please mark the bag as toiletry bag supplies. Please pray for our community and how we may continue to help CWHH.



Donations for San Bruno Hospitality House: There will be a plastic bin outside the door closest to the lower parking lot at Bethany for shelter donations so people can continue to donate for the shelter.
