Welcome to the month of March!

My mom and I took some UK friends to Filoli early in February, to see the beautiful gardens and grounds. Other than a few hearty daffodils pushing their way above ground (which we loved!), there were very few green growing things to see. While that made the visit a little less exciting, seeing that brave bright growth in the midst of the dark not-yet of the rest of the garden, was also a great reminder of the coming rebirth and new life that daffodils have come to represent.

Often the first to peek their green shoots above ground, they are able to bring the first signs of brightness after a cold dark winter. Daffodils are an early reminder of nature's promise of light after darkness, and hope in the midst of gloom.

In the church year we are just beginning the season of Lent. It is a time of following Jesus through the wilderness of temptation as we look at our own lives to see what temptations live in us and call us away from God. In the early church the season of Lent was a time of preparation for baptism on Easter, so often Lent is seen as a time of great cleansing. 


Deacon's Notes


Lenten Study at Bethany

For our Lenten study this year will be enjoying a unique pilgrimage with each other, as we follow this daily Lenten devotional from the *Presbyterian Outlook*. In *Local Pilgrim* we are invited to be as pilgrims, as we explore and observe both new and familiar places in our communities. For example, one of the authors went to many new places and set her intention to just observe and be open to how God was present in these new places. Whether it is a new place, or a routine place we find ourselves – the post office, the grocery store, a walk near the shore – the question to us in these pages is, **What will God reveal to us when we pause, ponder and reflect?** Who do we see? What do we hear? **God reveals God's self when we look.**



Although the devotional we will use covers *every* day during Lent, at our class time we will only be looking at the devotional presented for that particular Tuesday. We have been meeting as a group *in person at Bethany, on Tuesdays from 5:00-6:00pm.* Due to our session meeting on March 12, there will not be class that evening. I hope to see you there!

Building and Grounds Issues

- In progress: replacement of our antiquated electrical panel for maximum efficiency. Next steps: 1. Update electrical panel, 2. Decide on solar energy panels/ installation, and 3. Install heat pump.
- In progress: Room 9 clean-up.
- In progress: The Kitchen Update Committee cleanup and clean out. Another cleanup day will be scheduled soon. Lowe's was called for assistance; we will continue to work with them towards our vision.
- Patio repair – discussion occurred with Session at our February meeting.
- Upper Roof Repair – on hold for now
- In progress: On-line giving opportunities. More information to come.
- Global Witness and Peacemaking Offering – need a decision on where/what to do with the 25% of the 2023 offering (\$205.25)
- A new color copier is in place at the church.
- Bethany's 2024 budget was approved at the Session's February meeting and then was presented at Bethany's annual meeting on February 18, 2024.



Session Highlights - February 6, 2024

Pastor: Deb reported.

- There will be an Adult Ed Lenten Class on Tuesdays 5-6pm from Feb. 20-Mar 26, except session night on March 12, 2024.
- New Member Sunday – We received the transfer from Burlingame Presbyterian for Walt and Doreen Bird; they will be welcomed as new members on Sunday, March 3rd.

Buildings and Grounds: Dave reported.

- Dave spoke to Tom Jessee about finding an electrician to help upgrade the electrical panel at Bethany.
- A crew is needed to install chains across entrance and exit driveways to prevent illicit activity at night on the church grounds, usually between 10 pm and 3 am. Posts need to be placed and chains with locks will be installed to keep the parking lots closed during those hours. The Sikh Community is in favor of this plan, and they are willing to lock up the chains at night and open them up in the morning. The chains will be open during the day. Dave and George will also have keys. We will give this plan a 3-month trial to make sure it is effective. George is monitoring the security cameras in the parking lot and inside the church building.
- A workday will be organized before Easter.

Financial Trustees: Lyn reported.

- A budget for the 2024 year was presented to Session. It was approved by the Financial Trustees, and the Session approved it by consensus. Session members had the opportunity to ask questions and make comments about the current budget. The budget will be presented to the congregation at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 18, and they will be allowed to have their questions answered.

Worship: Pam reported.

- There will be an Ash Wednesday service on 2/14/24 at 5:00 pm..
- Jessica is out on medical leave until the beginning of April. Amy Stephens-Chen will be playing the piano during worship all of February and March 24 and 31. Pam will play on March 3, 10, and 17.
- Pam and Fred Matthews will be moving to Missoula, MT probably in the late spring. Pam is encouraging a discussion about Bethany's music program in the future.

Community Action: Lyn reported.

- Lyn remains chair of Community Action, including work on Catholic Worker and other benevolent actions. She is no longer chair of Community Life. There will be a different way to organize Thanksgiving Dinner, Spring Tea, Movie Nights, Game Nights, and other enjoyable activities.

Other Business:

- Bethany needs someone to help with IT issues.
- The next meeting date will be on Tuesday, March 12, 2024 at 4:30 pm.
