As I write this on April 28th the local news has just told us that the Shelter in Place order will extend through the month of May. This means that by the next time I write a letter for this monthly page, we will have been quarantined, locked down, staying at home, not gathering for 30 more days.

I can't say that I like this news. But I can say that I think this is the right news.

As we all try to find ways to cope these days I want to remind us that we are children of God and therefore are born with inherent worth. It may be that the changes we have had to make while we shelter in place have affected us in more than one way. We may have made changes to our lives that affect our finances, our work, our daily activities, and all of these things may make us doubt our own self worth or value. Our very identity is being changed by what we are being asked to do. Some of us thrive with such a challenge, and find new ways to be our best selves and meet the daily ever changing routines of our days. We love to engage with our families and our friends in new ways and we love to find new opportunities to find meaning with those that we love and the things that we do. (by Zoom conference call 7:05 PM- 8:32 PM)

Meeting was opened in prayer by Debra McGuire, pastor.

Deb led the Devotion reflecting on the poem Blessing For A Nurse by John O'Donohue. We also, named and prayed for all the people we know working in Frontline Covid-19 situations.

We all discussed our contact with Bethany family and friends.

Regarding Worship service we discussed ways to make it even better than it is already.

Lyn reported for the Financial Trustees:

- \$5,000 was received from the SF Presbytery for use during the Covid-19 issue. BPC will send \$500 to Catholic Worker House.

- The Presbytery also sent \$1,000 for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.
- BPC received 95% of giving the 1st quarter of 2020.

Dave reported for Buildings & Grounds that BPC received \$1,000 from PG&E for use of Bethany's parking lot, as a staging area, during 2 neighborhood power pole replacement workdays.

Worship will be looking for volunteers to share camera operation duties and lectionary reading in the upcoming months.

Detailed discussion regarding:

- Reaching out to BPC family and friends through correspondence, email, phone call, BPC website, Zoom, Skype, Hangouts.
- Using creative programming like Zoom for a Hymn Sing, 1st Saturday Dinner and/or weekday Prayer Meeting to collect prayers for Sunday Worship. (All of these are being considered and/or planned.)

Please mail your offering to the church as we are making weekly deposits to ensure our staff is paid and bills are kept current. We thank you in advance for your faithful giving during this unusual time.

In April, the Presbytery of San Francisco sent all 68 churches in the Presbytery a grant check for \$5,000 to be used as needed. From that \$5,000, the Financial Trustees recommended to the Session that we send \$500 to the Catholic Worker Hospitality House (the San Bruno Shelter) as those in need in San Bruno are going to the Shelter for food and other supplies. The recommendation was approved by Session and a check was sent to CWHH.

In addition, the Presbytery of San Francisco sent churches a check for \$1,000 for the Pastor Discretionary Fund, if a request was received. We made a request so Bethany received a check for a \$1,000 grant. This will allow our pastor to recommend funds be given, as needed, to a congregant, a friend of the church, or anyone else. To date no requests have been made but we know that as our current situation goes on, requests may be made.

The Financial Trustees also contacted the Board of Pensions about a pension waiver or deferral program that was put in place for pastor's pension payments. In order to receive the one-to-three month waiver of pension payments, there were certain criteria that had to be met. Unfortunately, Bethany did not meet the waiver criteria. We were offered three months of deferring our pastor's pension payment, but the Financial Trustees decided again deferring any payments.

The Financial Trustees also discussed applying for a Paycheck Protection Program "PPP" loan which can be forgiven depending on how the money is used, such as on payroll, benefits, etc. We are working on this item and more information will be available soon.
