Remember too, I love to talk. Give me a call.



### Pastor:

- Deb and Kathy Quickert met and updated several parts of Bethany's website.
- We are very close to having electronic giving options through Give.Lively.
- Lots of personal care provided this month. Randy Johansen and Rina Ranahan are in skilled nursing facilities.
- A Congregational Meeting to vote on the changes with Session and Deacons to one Leadership Group will be held on Sunday, November 17 after church. A Leadership Retreat will be planned in early 2025.

### **Financial Trustees:**

- We don't have the September data yet.
- Financial Trustees are looking at the budget for 2025.
- Monies for the solar work will come from funds at Presbytery.

### **Buildings and Grounds:**

- PG&E rep to be contacted to find out what the electrical capacity at Bethany is. This needs to be done before the solar array can be set up.
- Toilets were repaired in both bathrooms. A discussion was started regarding the issue of Gender Neutral bathrooms. More discussion needed on this topic.
- A Fall Work Day will be on Saturday, November 16 from 9-12.

### **Community Action:**

- The School Supplies drive went really well and the supplies were delivered to Belle Air School.
- Next up will be helping Catholic Worker with the Thanksgiving Dinner at the Shelter. Lyn will also ask Peter Stiehler for a list of gift requests for the residents at the shelter for Christmas.
- A sign-up sheet asking for volunteers to help plan the Thanksgiving Dinner (November 23) and Advent Festival (December 7) will be available at the church starting Sunday, October 13.

### Personnel:

George is working on pulpit supply for October 20th and November 10 when Deb is away.

### Worship:

- In progress: Room 9 clean-up, work continues on this room.
- In progress: The Kitchen Update Committee cleanup and clean out. Another cleanup day is being scheduled. We have started to look for kitchen remodel consultants in San Mateo County on the internet.
- Patio repair on hold for now suggestion was also made to extend patio to the edge of the west parking lot and possibly include a labyrinth.

- Upper Roof Repair on hold for now.
- In progress: On-line giving opportunities. We have received steps to put information on-line from WFB and GoLively. Further discussion is analysis and effort is in progress.
- Tree trimming of the two large trees near the west patio was completed by gardening services owner, Jaime Munoz.
