October 18, 2022 Session Meeting

The Devotion was led by Rev. McGuire. All present shared their love and thanks to Ken Henry, who was attending his last Session meeting before moving to Washington. It was a lovely, heartfelt time.

Reports:

<u>Pastor</u> - Advent series from Follow Me PCUSA resources "Make Peace" - a 4-week study. Deb has books, has set the dates. Deb will be on vacation from 11/21-11/28/22.

<u>Financial Trustees</u> - Financially stable through 3rd quarter because of very faithful giving by congregation. Deb's contract is being worked on for next year. Sikh Association lease is being updated. Stewardship campaign is coming with preliminary budget for next year being prepared. <u>Buildings and Grounds</u> - Cutting down of dead trees by PG&E is complete. Dave will contact them regarding the trees on the lower section the city property adjacent to Bethany's land because of continued fire risk.

Community Action/Life - Church Thanksgiving dinner will be on Saturday, November 19. Church to provide turkey, dressing, gravy, cranberry sauce, and drinks. Congregation invited to bring sides, salads, and desserts. Sign-up sheets will be available starting October 30. There will be a Food/Blanket/Coat drive for the Catholic Worker during the season of Thanksgiving. Advent Festival will be held on Saturday, Dec. 3. at 10:00 am. Lyn offered thanks for the people who helped with the Fond Farewell Party for Ken and Berta Henry. It was a wonderful event.

<u>Personnel</u> - George will be taking over this committee from Ken.

<u>Worship</u> - Nov. 6 will be Remembrance Sunday/All Saints' Day.

Nominating - Committee report will be placed on November agenda.

Other Business:

1. Mask wearing inside BPC. Mask wearing will be recommended, not required. We will continue to require people to be vaccinated if they are attending worship. 2. Use of BPC as San Mateo County Election Center. Machines will arrive at Bethany on Thursday, Nov. 3, and be picked up Thursday, Nov. 10. 3. New Stove. A new stove has been selected from Tri-Mark, the company Jorie Abbott works for. 4. Mission Study. The questions have been answered and sent for review and suggestions. We are hoping to have the paperwork to COM by their November meeting. 5. As Roberta Henry moves away, several people have volunteered to help with some of the secretarial tasks: Bonnie Morgan will write up the Wednesdays at Bethany and the Monthly newsletter, and Roxane will be checking emails and voicemails.

Financial Trustees: Updates on the following issues:

1. Renewal of Pastor Deb McGuire's 2023 annual contract/Mission Study:

Mission Study information was completed and forwarded to Betty Delaney from the Presbytery of San Francisco. We are now awaiting feedback and/or questions from Ms. Delaney. It is our hope to submit the information for the November 2022 COM meeting or their review, comments, and/or approval.

2. Renewal of the Sikh Association multi-year lease:

Suggested updates to the lease were completed and forwarded to Marda Stothers at the Presbytery of San Francisco, who in turn forwarded the information to the Presbytery's Legal counsel for review.

3. Cleanup of the Bethany Church grounds:

The Trustees brought a recommendation to Session on 10/18/22 for a one-time cleanup of the entire Bethany grounds. This was approved and bids will now be requested for this work from appropriate landscape renewal contractors.

4. Bids received:

Replacement or repair of the patio outside the church building:

This project is currently on hold until January 2023. Bids will be reviewed and/or updated.

Price information about a new stove for Bethany was also reviewed.

5. <u>Annual Stewardship Campaign for 2023:</u>

Our 2023 Stewardship Campaign will occur in November. Letters will be sent out to the congregation by early November. We will include information on how Bethany will be able to accept stock to fulfill donations.

We will again be using the PC(USA) Follow Me curriculum studying their series called Make Peace. *Make Peace* focuses on Jesus' words in the Beatitudes, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9), which have been the centerpiece of Christian social ethics for centuries. People, throughout history and still today, have chosen different paths to peace, but certain skills of peacemaking have emerged from their journeys: cultivating inner peace, seeking to understand

where others are coming from, and having the courage to overcome fear. By practicing these skills, peacemakers work to embody Jesus' teachings in the midst of conflict.
