The Trustees are working on the following issues:

- 1. Renewal of Pastor Deb McGuire's annual contract with Bethany for 2023 assisted by Marda Stothers from the Presbytery of San Francisco in her role as Partner of Mission and Church Assets.
- 2. Work on the Mission Study draft regarding finances, such as our overall financial condition and outlook for the future.
- 3. Renewal of the Sikh Association multi-year lease. The Trustees and Pastor McGuire met with representatives from the Sikh Association on Monday, September 13, to discuss the current lease, noting areas that will need updates.
- 4. Review of funds available for ongoing cleanup of the Bethany grounds.
- 5. Review of the bids received for replacement or repair of the patio outside of the church building. This project is currently on hold until January 2023.
- 6. Annual Stewardship Campaign. Our 2023 Stewardship Campaign will commence in late October/early November. Ongoing, Bethany is able to accept stock to be given to the church to fulfill pledges or other donations. A simple process has been in place which can be shared with the giving party's investment professional so stock can be given to the church. Contact Lyn Hughes at (650) 867-0667 for details.
- 7. Annual Church Budget preparation for 2023.
- 8. Change in Financial Trustees structure. With the departure of Ken Henry in October, 2022, Lyn Hughes will again take on the role of the Chair Financial Trustees.
