Dear friends,

I write this just after Ellen Kross's memorial service, a few days before our dear Roberta will attend and participate in her own sister's memorial, and a week before Freda Lutz' memorial. All of this has me thinking about heaven. I wonder if it really is salted caramel and chocolate?

As a hospice nurse, Tamra must have opportunity to reflect on life and death. As a hospice chaplain and pastor Ed Kross has had many opportunities to think about life and death. As a nurse Ellen Kross had probably thought about life and death quite a bit. All of us have had varying degrees of brushes with death, serious illness, debilitation, and other losses that drastically change one's life, forever. Maybe these things happened to us ourselves, or someone we loved or were close to, or to a dear pet. Maybe once; maybe multiple times.

Death itself is such a paradox. Time is paradoxical - sometimes even though things seem to happen so fast, each experience seems to move in slow motion. And vice versa. Our emotions run in opposite directions simultaneously - we don't want someone to die but we want their pain to end; death is such an uncomfortable topic and being around people near the end of their lives is not something we do often enough to know what to do or how to feel, and at the same time I know someone who was so excited to see Jesus that she had her daughter bring her balloons to her bedside.

Memorials are sad events for so many reasons, and yet I felt so much joy mixed in with the sadness today. Sad for me because I really wish I had known Ellen better. Joy because the room was simply bursting with the love for Ellen and for Ed and Angela, and for the memories each of you have shared with each other.

I couldn't even begin to make a list! Joy and thanksgiving for all of the help we had with sound, food, set up, clean up, bringing folks who needed assistance, and the service itself. As I mentioned today, the relationships at Bethany are long, and deep, and loving. I have to speak honestly though and say that those relationships were the source of some sadness for me, and maybe a twinge for you too. While this was by no means a long lasting or primary feeling from the day, I want to address it. When relationships are so deep and have lasted so long, any spoken or unspoken harm can feel like a real betrayal. While I don't know specifics or names (and I don't want to), I do know that in and amongst the beautiful memories you all share, are some painful stories for some of you. For some the pain is old and forgotten, for some it was triggered today perhaps, and for some there is just confusion. As we faced each other and recited our beautiful closing benediction, I prayed for hearts to be lifted. I know they were because I felt it. I want to address it because I feel as though today was an opportunity for something special. I wonder if you felt that way too?

In Jesus Christ we know that even though we die, still we live. It's true of all parts of our lives. What love is this that we should all be in one place celebrating the life of a true servant, learning about an even bigger love? Such knowledge is too wonderful for me. It is too high, I cannot attain it. And yet it is the love that Jesus has for us, poured into our hearts, that we feel for the other. If anything in you is broken, let's figure out how to repair. If anything in you is tired, let's figure out how to rest. If anything is joyful in you, let's talk about that too! I want to hear how you feel, about anything, any time. Whenever you're ready for a laugh, a prayer, a loving caring conversation, let's talk. The patio is open.

GUIDELINES FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP BETHANY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 12, 2021

In keeping with State and local guidelines and CDC guidelines we are posting this protocol for entry into our building. The space is deep cleaned once each week. Hand sanitizer is available. **Proof of vaccination is required.**

General

- -Please keep doors open for maximum air circulation
- -Properly fitting masks must be worn while indoors
- -Maintain distance from others

10:00am Sunday Worship Service

- -Open to all fully vaccinated people unless medically contraindicated (proof of vaccination required)
- -Please remain masked
- -Please sit at a distance from other parishioners
- -No touching greet one another creatively!
- -Singing is allowed while masked only
- -Food to be eaten outside only
- -Post- and pre-worship visiting outside only

1. News about our Partnership with Iglesias Brasiliana – San Mateo

We continue to collect items for Iglesias Brasiliana, our partner in San Mateo. We have received an updated "needs" list from Pastor Jorge from the IYB congregation:

Bottled water Rice and pinto beans Canned tomato sauce, diced tomatoes, or tomato paste Olive or avocado oil Paper products

Please continue to prayer for the IYB congregation and consider how you might help. Our next collection will be for Halloween treats for the children. Please bring Halloween candy and other Halloween goodies **to the church by Wednesday, October 20**, to be delivered on Friday, October 22.

We are also planning something similar to Halloween for Thanksgiving (to be determined), Discussions are continuing with Pastor Abdala about how we might help our Partner church for Christmas.

- 2. Ongoing we will be providing funds from our Fund-a-Vision grant to the Catholic Worker Hospitality House (the San Bruno Shelter) for various needs. We made our fourth payment of \$5,000 from the grant in September.
- 3. We will NOT have a Thanksgiving dinner at Bethany this year. However, we will have a "drive through" collection for items for the Catholic Worker Hospitality House (the San Bruno Shelter) on **Saturday, November 20, from 2 pm to 4pm** so you may drop off anything you wish to provide to the Shelter such as nonperishable food, blankets, coats, sweatshirts, jackets, etc.
- 4. Our Stewardship Campaign will begin in November. Check Wednesdays@Bethany and the November Banner for further information and begin to think about how you might support Bethany Church in 2022.

September 21, 2021 SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Memorial Services will be held at Bethany for two beloved members. Ellen Kross was remembered fondly on Tuesday, September 28 at 11:00 am. Her son Rev. Ed Kross was present for the service, and a light reception was held at the church for those in attendance.
- Freda Lutz will be remembered on Saturday, October 9, also at 11:00 am. Rev. Garry Cox will be leading worship for Freda's service. Proof of vaccination will be required at both services, and masks will be available for anyone needing one.
- Financial Trustees report that the August church budget is "right on track." Stewardship campaign for 2022 will be held in the fall.
- Buildings and Grounds are in contact with tree trimming person to address dead or dying trees on our property. Roxane and Dave Wales are drawing up a list of tasks that can be accomplished by individuals in a time frame that works for them. Keep your eyes open for that list!
- Community Action/Life announced that, because of continued concerns about Covid, there will not be a Thanksgiving Dinner or an Advent Festival again this year. However, there will be a drive through food collection for Catholic Worker on November 20.
- Outreach voiced appreciation for the parking lot striping and new entrance and exit signs, all completed before the reopening on September 12.
- Worship schedule looking ahead includes World Communion Sunday on October 3, All Saint's Day on October 31, and Advent beginning on November 28.
- A final vote to paint the wall above the trim at the back of the sanctuary was approved.
- Pastor Deb thanked everyone for all the efforts in getting the church ready for Opening Day.


