

SEPTEMBER 22, 2020 SESSION MEETING

(by Zoom conference call 7:04 PM - 8:44 PM)

Pastor Deb opened the meeting in prayer, lighting the Christ Candle and leading a meditation discussion about how we are using our origami paper box containing our hopes and dreams for BPC.

Roxane asked if anyone has information about the whereabouts and wellbeing of Bill Marsh since the last 2 BPC newsletters have been returned from his San Jose address as No Such Address. Please contact me or the BPC office if you have this info.

Financial Trustees report receiving over 90% of pledges for this quarter. They will begin preparing the 2021 budget after the September numbers are reported.

The Sikh Association, with the approval of Session, will begin the removal of the lower level, aging play structure and upgrade the ground surface.

We had a detailed discussion about Bethany grounds. It was moved, seconded & passed that the parking lot storage container may be sold. George Lynch will work on this.

A B&G Task Force (Dave W., Lyn H., Kathleen M.) will look into the possibility of hiring a landscaper to assist with evaluation of mid-parking lot medium shrubs/trees upkeep being mindful of memorial plantings, healing garden, shrubbery, parking lot surface, and removal of any dead trees.

The Community Life Committee will not host a Thanksgiving dinner this year but may use this time as a collection of non-perishable food for the SB Shelter.

The Outreach Committee is planning the implementation of a Little Library in the front patio area of BPC.

The Worship Committee is planning outdoor worship services on Oct. 4 and Nov. 1, along with Facebook Live.

Choir and Prayz are practicing on Wednesdays, and will sing in Worship on alternating Sundays

1. After much discussion, Community Life has decided we will forego the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner at the church this year

However, so our congregation, friends, and family may contribute to our annual Thanksgiving collection for the San Bruno Shelter, we will have barrels available in our parking lot for nonperishable food and supply donations. We will have people at the church to assist those who would like to drive through the church parking lot and add their donations to the barrels.

2. Ongoing News about Our Partnership with Iglesias Braziliana – San Mateo

Iglesias Braziliana, a San Mateo congregation, has 140 families, 85% unemployment, and new babies. They need our help.

Bethany learned of their situation from Rev. Janet Bower and became their partner. We have now delivered multiple loads of household goods, baby items, nonperishable food, women's clothes, toiletries, and many cases of diapers and baby wipes. From the church's parking lot in San Mateo, there are distributions every Friday. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this ongoing effort.

Here is a list of items needed for the congregation:

Continued prayers

Household goods – Towels, blankets, sheets and pillow cases, kitchenware, dishes, glasses, pots and pans, silverware, etc.

Baby clothes – Newborn through 6 mons: new or clean, used

Diapers – Newborn through 6 mons

Food - rice, dry beans, canned goods, any items with a shelf-life/nonperishable

Toiletries – all kinds

Target gift cards in any amount

Checks payable to Iglesias Braziliana (To send a check, in any amount, make your check payable to Iglesias Braziliana and mail it to 194 W. 25th Avenue, San Mateo, CA 94403)

You can bring items for Iglesias Braziliana to Bethany Church; we will ensure they are delivered to San Mateo. You can also call Lyn Hughes and arrange for items to be picked up.

Christmas is right around the corner:

We have also committed to providing **140** - \$25 Target cards (1 for each IB church family) at Christmas. Additionally, we will provide 40 toys for the children, babies through 10 years old, in addition to the gift cards. Please consider how you can help with our Christmas project for our partner.

In addition, the Trustees are considering a donation from Memorials to assist two young people from the church, Marco Abdala and Marina de Castro, to attend educational classes to become Commissioned Lay Pastors in the Presbyterian Church – PCUSA. The donation would allow them to attend classes offered by Escuela Latinoamericana de Estudios Teologicos. Further information will be provided once a decision has been made.

3. Our Grant Request was Approved! Soon we will start the Bethany Presbyterian Church and Catholic Worker Hospitality House Food Distribution Partnership

Our \$50,000 grant request was approved by the churches of the Presbytery of San Francisco on Saturday, September 12, 2020. It was a very exciting day, filled with hope, joy, and thanksgiving. We are now awaiting the grant check, which should be by October 1, 2020. We will begin to make future arrangements for food distributions soon.
