*Free Covid-19 At-Home Tests now Available*: You can now order free at-home tests through the USPS! There's a limit of one order (4 tests) per residential address. These are rapid antigen tests – no lab required, results in approx. 30 minutes. You can go directly to the USPS site to order them: <u>https://special.usps.com/testkits</u>

In addition, if you purchase at-home tests after January 15<sup>th</sup>, your health insurance company is required to reimburse you. Check with your insurance company for details.
