Holy Week and Easter

Good Friday: There will be two quiet, meditative, scripture-filled short services on Good Friday, April 15th. The first service will be at noon, and the second at 3 p.m. Please feel free to drop in for one or both of these services.

Easter Sunrise Service: Easter services at Bethany will begin at dawn with a Sunrise Service at 6:15 am up on the hill in the Sunrise area above the upper parking lot. Congregants are invited to join together for a joyful celebration as we proclaim the good news that Christ is risen!! Pastor Deb will share a message of hope and promise as we remember the resurrection of our Lord. It is a good idea to dress warmly and bring along a blanket for the chilly morning air. There will be a reception following the service with lots of hot coffee, juice, sticky rolls, and other delights. A sign-up sheet for the reception will be available in the narthex, so please sign up if you can bring something to share.

Easter Worship Service: Easter will also be celebrated at our regular worship time of 10:00 am. There will be beautiful music, another message of hope and promise by Pastor Deb, the Biblical story of the resurrection, wonderful hymns, and a time for prayer.
