

Donations are also welcome to help purchase these supplies. Please continue to prayer for this congregation and consider how you might be able to help. We continue with discussions about how we might help through the end of this year.

We also plan to put together 25 – 50 additional toiletry bags for CWHH by the end of August. Items needed are bars of soap, washcloths, disposable razors, small deodorants, small bottles of shampoo, combs, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and socks.
