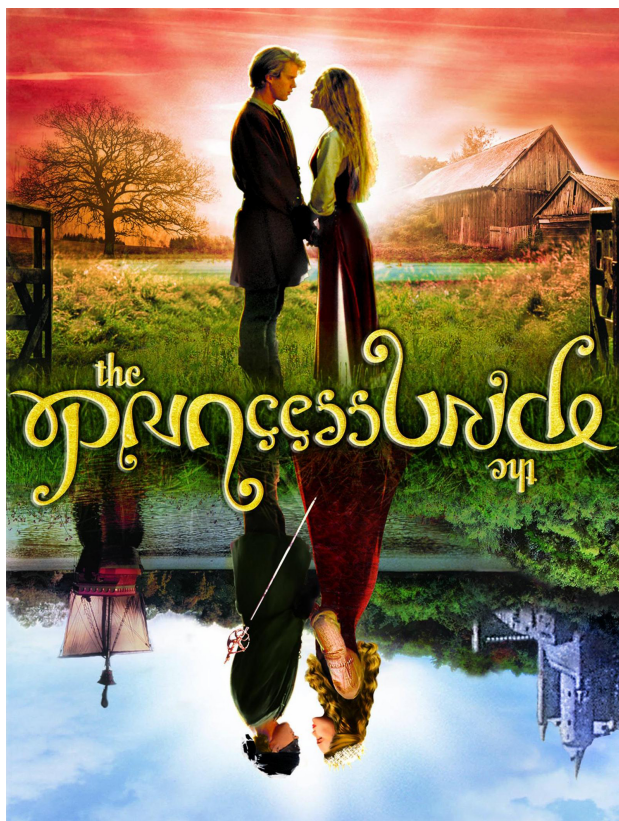

Memorial Dedication at Tanforan: The public is invited to the ribbon-cutting ceremony of the Tanforan Memorial on **Saturday, August 27, 2022, at 1:00 p.m.**, which will take place outside the San Bruno BART station at 1151 Huntington Ave.

Tanforan is the site of the former racetrack that was converted into a detention center for Japanese Americans from April through October of 1942. More information is available on the website: <https://www.tanforanmemorial.org/exhibits>

Also of interest is the **Sansei Granddaughters' Journey**, a show honoring the history of the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II, will be on display **through Saturday, Sept. 3**, at the AZ Gallery at the Shops at Tanforan in San Bruno. In 1942, the Tanforan racetrack became the temporary detention center for nearly 8,000 Japanese Americans until their transfer to Topaz, a WRA camp in Utah. Shari Arai DeBoer, one of five third generation (sansei) Japanese American artists, shows two of her paintings honoring the resilience of those who were interned for the duration of the war. 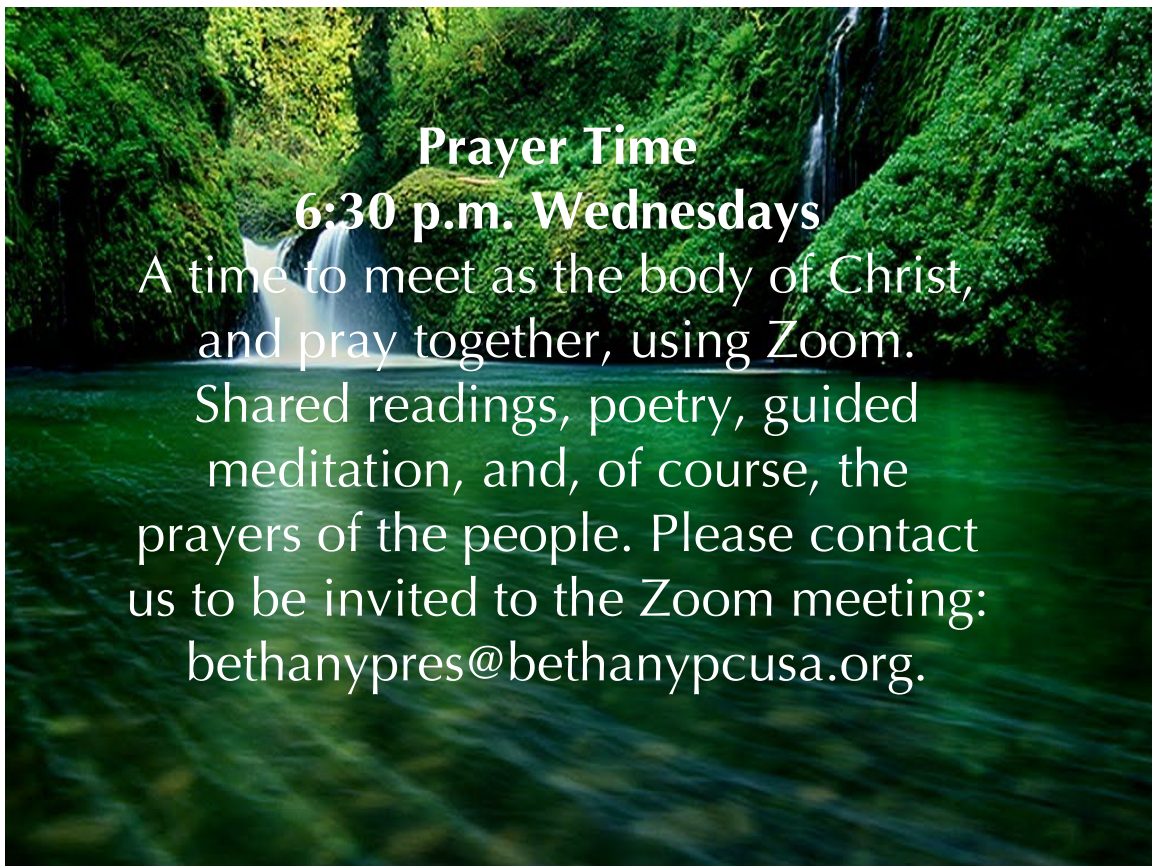
Committee on Ministry: The second workshop that was held at Bethany in April covered a lot of the information for the third workshop. The next part is about the financial nuts and bolts, and will be completed by Session and the Trustees at a meeting **on August 27 at 10 a.m.** After that work is completed, a Pastor Nominating Committee can be formed.

Pastor Nominating Committee: The Bethany Presbyterian Church congregation held two workshops this spring to answer several of the questions required to complete a Mission Study, a major step in the process of calling a permanent pastor. Session and the Board of Trustees will meet on August 27th to discuss the financial questions, and then it will be time to assemble the Pastor Nominating Committee. This committee must be comprised of members of the church, and Session is seeking 3-4 people who would be willing to serve.
