Big News: The Henrys are moving! Ken and Roberta have bought a house together with their daughter Sarah and son-in-law Spencer, and will be moving at the end of October to Marysville, WA. This means: we're gonna need a new secretary! Details about the position will come soon, but if you're interested, you can leave your name with Pastor Deb or the church office, and the search committee will get back to you with specifics when they have them.

Pastor Nominating Committee: The Bethany Presbyterian Church congregation and the Session/Financial Trustees have held several workshops to answer questions required to complete a Mission Study, a major step in the process of calling a permanent pastor. Using information gathered in these sessions, a Mission Study will soon be written, and the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) will be called into service. The PNC must be comprised of members of the church, and Session is seeking 3-4 people who would be willing to serve. <u>Peacemaking and World Communion Sunday</u>: Bethany will be celebrating Peacemaking/World Communion Sunday on **Sunday**, **October 2**. On World Communion Sunday, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. We celebrate that we are connected, we are loved, and we are not alone.

Our congregation is participating in the Peacemaking Offering, now called the Peace & Global Witness Offering. Sunday, September 4 marked the day that "A Season of Peace" began, and we will be dedicating the Offering on World Communion Sunday, October 2. Of the funds collected, 25% will remain with Bethany to support our own efforts towards peacemaking. We will be partnering with local students by sponsoring an essay writing/artistic expression opportunity about what A Season of Peace might look like. Alicia McHale, a dear friend and a favorite 5th Grade teacher at Allen School, will be helping to promote this idea with the students at Allen, and we will be sharing their ideas with the congregation. We also encourage you to consider what a Season of Peace might be, and invite you and your family to participate in sharing your artistic expressions on this topic as well.

Offering envelopes are available at the church and will be provided throughout this Season of Peace. Please prayerfully consider supporting this offering, which allows the Presbyterian Church both locally and abroad, to help those struggling through oppression and injustice. May Christ's peace be a part of all of your days.
