<u>During the Session meeting on Tuesday evening</u>, Lyn Hughes presented information from the San Francisco Presbytery's Finance Committee about churches that are in dire circumstances due to members being unemployed, offerings being at 10% of prior giving levels, food banks and other services that are out of funds, etc.

The Session decided to send some funds from Bethany Church from Community Action's budget which will be \$300 (6 months of the suggested donation of \$50). Others, individually or by another group, can send their check(s) as follows: (Presbytery's Finance Committee provided two churches located in San Mateo):

Latinos Unidos en Cristo 194 W. 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue San Mateo, CA 94403 (a Hispanic congregation)

Iglesia Braziliana 194 W. 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue San Mateo, CA 94403 (a Brazilian congregation)

Both these congregations rent from First Presbyterian Church of San Mateo but are greatly in need to support their congregants and the neighborhood.
