At our Ash Wednesday service, we created jazz. Jazz takes the straight,

expected path and improvises in such a beautiful way that an even better sound emerges. Without electricity at church, our planned service was not going to be possible. We improvised ourselves into a beautiful intimate time of prayer and song and silence and candles and ashes. We set up the



Christ candle surrounded by lots of tea candles on a few tv trays near the

entrance to the sanctuary, so that people who

entered weren't forced to navigate the chairs



in the dark and find their way to the front. We brought down one of the candelabras from the chancel and added two more candlesticks to the table. We had about six or seven chairs around the candles. From where we sat, the candle light lit our starry ceiling with a beautiful unexpected sparkle.

In a weekly essay in the webzine "Journey with Jesus" Dan Clendenin writes, "I love Lent. It reminds me that I don't need to be stuck in old ways of thinking and acting. Renewal is possible. I can wipe the mud off my glasses. Hit the reset button. I don't need to wait for old age to magically impart a new perspective on what matters most and why." He continues, "In a culture that glorifies excess and indulgence, hubris and bravado, Wednesday's ashes signify an outrageously counter-cultural act of humility. Lent is the most brutally realistic liturgical season of the year — it's a time when we tell the truth about ourselves, our brokenness, our mortality, and

nevertheless trust in God's redemptive love. We celebrate the gift of life with all its blessings and sorrows."

By the time our next newsletter comes to you, we will be nearing the excitement and glory of the upcoming Easter celebration. Until then, how will you use this 40 day journey you have been given? What will accompany you? Upon what foundation will you rest? What truth will you tell about yourself?

You are safe. You are loved. You are full of the grace of God. As always, let's talk.





February 21, 2023 Session Meeting

1. Clerk of Session

- A discussion was held regarding our current COVID requirements for attending worship and events at the church. The Session is grateful for the congregation's efforts in keeping everyone safe throughout the pandemic, and we are taking a new stance. The signs outside regarding vaccinations and masks will be taken down, and masks will be optional.
- Session meeting times. All present agreed that meeting at 4:30 pm works well.

2. Pastor's Report: Deb reported.

- Deb;s vacation and study leave schedule for the remainder of the year is as follows:
 - April 19 25: Vacation and possibly the Westminster Woods Women's Weekend
 - May 15 22: Study leave; Festival of Homiletics
 - June 19 26: Study leave; Mercy Center Retreat
 - September 11 18: Vacation
 - November 27 December 4: Vacation
 - December 25 January 1: Vacation
- Deb has been helping Cathleen Torres, Administrative Assistant, get settled in, and things are going really well. Cathleen will be in the office on Tuesdays and Fridays, and working remotely M,W, and Th.

3. Financial Trustees. Lyn reported.

- Bids are being sought for the cleanup of the church grounds and replacement of the patio. Lyn is in charge of getting the bids.
- Deb's contract has been renewed. The Pastor Nominating Committee is working to get the paperwork for the MIF completed and in to the Committee on Ministry before their next meeting on March 2.
- The negotiations for the lease with the Sikh group have been completed and accepted.

4. Buildings and Grounds. Dave reported.

- The old shed has been brought back up the hill and will be taken to the dump. There are several items that need to be removed from Room 9 downstairs also, so Session agreed to hire a hauling service to take things out of Room 9, the old choir room, and the Sunday School supply room.
- New stove pilots. The stove does not have electronic starters. 5 of the pilot lights will be turned off, leaving only the ones closet to the island lit. The other pilots can be re-lit as needed.
- Church-wide clean up day will be on Saturday, March 25.

5. Community Action/Life and Outreach. Lyn reported.

- We continue to collect items for the shelter. They are requesting warm clothing items during this cold time of year and paper supplies.
- Game Night with Pizza and Cookies is being planned and the date will be announced soon.

6. Worship Committee. Pam reported.

• Good Friday and Easter services will be discussed at the next Worship Committee meeting on March 12.

Financial Trustees

We are grateful for your ongoing support. Thank you for your faithfulness! Updates on the following issues:

- 1. **Renewal of Pastor Deb McGuire's 2023 Annual Contract/Mission Study**: Each committee member provided draft information to Pam Matthews, Chair of the newly elected BPC Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Next steps are consolidating the information received from the committee members to finalize the document to PoSF. We are now working towards a submission date in March so the document can be reviewed at the March Presbytery meeting.
- 2. Renewal of the Sikh Association Multi-Year Lease (February. 2023 March, 2028): Michael Glass, legal counsel for the Presbytery of San Francisco, provided a redlined lease for review which included updates from the Sikh Association as well as the Bethany Trustees. The Sikhs accepted the lease as written, and Mr. Glass was notified that the lease was ready to be finalized for signature. We expect to sign the lease the week of February 20, 2023. The lease provides for a five-year lease with an option to renew the lease for an additional five years. There are 3% rent increases year-over-year for the next 10 years. We feel very fortunate we came to a lease agreement continuation with our tenant and thanks to everyone for their efforts in the lease negotiations.
- 3. **Cleanup of the Bethany Church Grounds:** The Trustees brought a recommendation to Session on 10/18/22 for a one- time cleanup of the entire Bethany grounds. This recommendation was approved. The Trustees are in the process of requesting bids for this project.
- 4. Bids Received and Action Taken:
 - a. Replacement or Repair of the Patio Outside the Church Building: This project has been on hold, but will be re-addressed in mid-2023. Bids will be reviewed and/or updated so the work can be started on the patio in the summer.
- 5. **Removal of Old Equipment/Furniture at Bethany:** An effort is underway to remove various equipment, such as unusable old pianos in Room 9, and items in storage under the stairs that will not be used in the future. These are items that can't be donated so must be hauled away. George Lynch is heading this effort. If questions, please contact George at (650) 580-4123 or Lyn Hughes at (650) 867-0667.
